Strategic Direction: 1. Libraries in Society

We will empower libraries to build literate, informed and participative societies. We will develop strategies and tools to enable libraries to act as key providers of information, education, research, culture and social participation.

Strategic Direction: 2. Information and Knowledge

We will build a framework that promotes equitable access to information and knowledge in any format and in any place. We will establish the capacity for libraries to act as catalysts of innovation, able to facilitate the creation and re-use of content by their communities.
