



National Libraries Section Annual report September 2016 – August 2017

Our Annual Report records our achievements and progress in relation to our [Action Plan 2016-2017](#). 2017 was an election year: the number of candidates for the SC showed that there is a great interest in the Section and its activities. Melita Ambrožič stood down from the position of Information Officer after 7 years; Stuart Hamilton was elected Information Officer for period 2017-2019.

The survey was sent out and 46 responses from 45 sovereign states were received.
